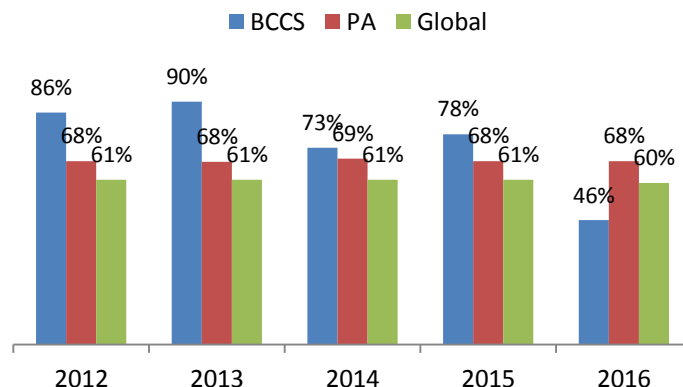

COLLEGE PREPARATORY MATH NOTE:

The Saxon math system is used for college preparatory math. Geometry is integrated throughout the Saxon math program. Students who have taken Saxon Algebra I and Algebra II are prepared to meet a liberal arts college's admissions standards, which ordinarily require geometry as well as Algebra I and II. A separate Geometry course is available for students in need of it.

ATHLETICS

BCCS offers a variety of opportunities for students to participate in athletics. Our athletic program strives to teach students to work at whatever they do with all of their hearts and to do everything for the glory of God.

At the High School level (Grades 9-12), BCCS competes in the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL, a division of the PIAA) in girls' volleyball, boys' soccer, and boys' volleyball. We play independent schedules in girls' basketball and boys' basketball. BCCS athletes also have the opportunity to compete in the WPIAL in wrestling, swimming, baseball, softball, boys' tennis, girls' lacrosse, track, football, girls' soccer, girls' tennis, cross country, and golf through the cooperative agreement with Blackhawk High School.

Since joining the WPIAL in 2008, the girls' volleyball team won the WPIAL Class A Championship, the boys' soccer team reached the WPIAL Class A Championship game, and the boys' volleyball team reached the WPIAL Class AA Semifinals and 2016 WPIAL Class AA Champions and PIAA Quarter Finals.
